Our Year in Review

Welcome to the first issue of our newsletter which is coming to you as a valued funding partner of the Grantham Academy for Primary & Secondary Schools (GAPS)

Your funding has helped GAPS to provide dedicated coaching sessions in six primary schools and one secondary school in the Grantham area this year as well as to run a twice weekly training academy for children wishing to take their coaching to the next level.

Based at Cliffedale Primary School in Grantham and supported by headmaster Robert Young, GAPS is run by local table tennis coach John Mapletoft who visits the participating schools to run coaching sessions as either after school clubs or as part of the school curriculum. These sessions are intended as an introduction to the sport for children who might otherwise have never had the opportunity to try their hand at one of the fastest games in the world.


The progression of the children's' interest and skillset is supported by the opportunity for them to attend the GAPS training sessions which are run twice weekly at Cliffedale Primary School. The sessions run for four hours and are split into two different

classes to allow the coaches to support the different abilities of the children attending.

Your funding helps GAPS to pay for world class coaches to attend and pass their skills to the younger generation, we are currently lucky enough to have the support of Commonwealth Games double gold medalist Gareth Herbert (pictured above at the club's Olympic Legacy launch night). We are also supported by experienced ETTA UK Level 2 coach Russell Winfield as well as several local high achieving players who mentor the children at the sessions.

GAPS is keen to introduce the children to competitive sport so as well as ensuring that match play is an integral part of their training sessions, players are encouraged to enter local tournaments. If none were available, we have organized them so that children get a sense of what taking part in a sport is really about.

- To promote and maintain the highest standards of technical competence and safety in the sport using International Table Tennis

Federation (ITTF) Guidelines.

10) To uphold the rules of the sport and promote team working, leadership and fair play.

Our Goals for 2014

In 2013 we set out to reduce the void left when sports funding was cut for Lincolnshire Schools Partnership.

It was our aim to introduce young children to table tennis and help even 'unsporty' kids to enjoy the benefits that you get from taking part.

It was also our aim to encourage children to progress in the sport if they enjoyed it, showed a willingness to learn and demonstrated the attitude and talent that would benefit from specialist coaching.

We believe that we have set out on the road to achieving this and it is our aim to continue with this in 2014.

The contributions that we have received from our supporters pays for things such as:

- Rental of halls to hold training sessions
- New equipment such as bats, balls and table tennis robots
- Fees for professional table tennis coaches
- Expenses for County standard knocking partners for the children

It would be impossible to run the academy without funding for these essential items and we would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your kind donation this year.

In 2014, we would like to expand the presence of the academy and increase our support in areas such

- Subsidising a junior Butterfly League
- Providing bursary funds for disadvantaged children
- Fund more local, interschool tournaments
- Focus on developing girls' table tennis in Grantham
- Provide more professional coaching

Eventually, we would like to be able to develop and support a training program for upcoming coaches and umpires, taking the promising players of today and turning them into the mentors of tomorrow.
